Dear Ms. Stanwyck:

Upon recommendations of Dr. Nagaraj Neerchal and Dr. Philip Rous, I have secured President Freeman Hrabowski's approval of your appointment as Lecturer in the Department of Mathematics & Statistics for the period of three academic years beginning August 23, 2010 and ending May 22, 2013. Academic Year 2010-11 will be a probationary year with a performance evaluation and decision on continuation to be made before March 1, 2011. Your compensation for the 2010-11 academic year will be \$54,000 with benefits. Service under this Agreement does not qualify you to accrue service towards academic tenure.

The University will provide funds, not to exceed \$3,000, for computer equipment, and funds, not the exceed \$4,500, for travel to visit campuses known for their Active Learning approach. These funds are provided with the expectation that expenditures will be encumbered prior to June 30, 2011. Additionally, summer salary for FY 2012 and FY 2013 will be provided by the Dean of the College of Natural and Mathematical Sciences at a rate of \$6,000 per summer for CASTLE teaching and writing.

This will be a full-time appointment at UMBC, subject to the benefits provided and policies governing full-time faculty by the personnel regulations of the State and the University System of Maryland. For a detailed description of those policies, I refer you to the Faculty Handbook, which is available online at http://www.umbc.edu/provost. The Table of Contents is enclosed for your reference.

This letter and the documents stating University System of Maryland and University of Maryland Baltimore County policies and procedures applicable to faculty, as amended from time to time, contain all of the terms and conditions for your employment. These terms and conditions may not be modified by oral agreements and constitute the entire agreement between you and the University of Maryland Baltimore County.

We extend to you warm wishes for a happy and fruitful association with the University of Maryland Baltimore County. To that end, please plan on spending August 24, 2010 (8:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.) participating in New Faculty Welcome: An Introduction to the UMBC Community. The program will include practical information for starting in your faculty role at UMBC, discussion of expectations, and opportunities to get to know administrators and other new faculty.

Teaching Improvements					
New Courses Developed	With a grant from the Alex Brown Center for Entrepreneurship, I created a new course Introduction to Statistical Consulting. This course is ready to run but there has not yet been an opportunity to put it on the schedule. It is radically different than traditional courses, since student grades depend entirely on their progress on several consulting projects (rather than exams or quizzes).				
Current Courses Revised	I revised the Stat 351 course, including changing the textbook and incorporating an online homework system (MyStatLAb), as well as changing the primary method of analysis from Excel to an online statistical analysis application bundled with MyStatLab (StatCrunch). I have also been working to infuse active learning and team - based activities into Math 155, in order to contribute to the college - wide iCubed study.				
Improvement of Pedagogical Skills	I regularly attend faculty development workshops aimed at improving pedagogical skills. These workshops discuss such topics as using technology in the classroom, developing effective assessment, and creating writing assignments that truly reflect student learning. If appropriate, I bring the knowledge I gain from these workshops into the classroom (and although not every innovation works out, many do - to the benefit of my students).

Thank you for agreeing to be the designated coordinator for Math 155, Stat 350 and Stat 351. As we discussed, coordinators will have be responsible for dealing with specific issues related to setting up the course, especially those coming up in either Summer (for Fall courses) and Winter (for Spring courses) sessions. The expanded responsibilities of a course coordinator will include the following.

- Master Syllabus of the course to be used by EVERYONE teaching the class
- Responsible for making sure that course syllabi conform to the Provost's requirements.
- Be responsible for the Common Final for the course
- Making online HW assignments for the course
- Assessment Test development and implementation
- Coordination between all the faculty teaching the course
- Coordination between all the TAs involved.
- Textbook Issues
- First point of contact with course questions or issues.

As an appreciation for taking up this significant task, you will receive a stipend of \$2250. The stipend will be paid in summer following the academic year in which you coordinated assigned courses.
